Public Transport

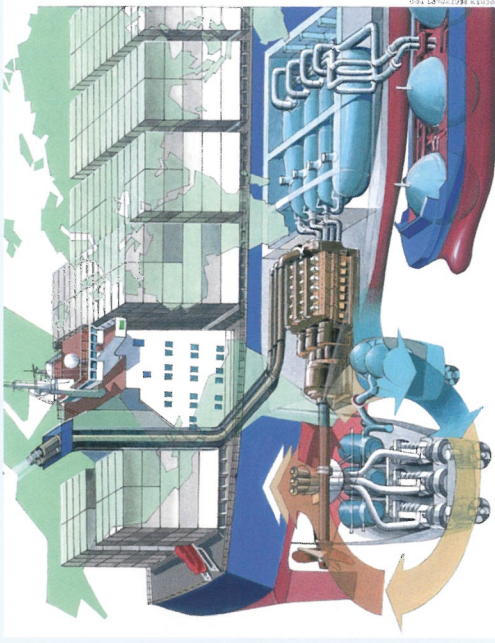
- From Hamburg main station S-Bahn line S1 or S3 in direction Altona until Landungsbrücken stop.
